

# ATA CARNET - SECURITY RATE CHART (includes 10% Penalty Rate)

The ATA Carnet provides a guarantee to the Customs of a foreign country into which the goods are temporarily imported that all duties, taxes etc. will be paid to them in the conditions under which they allow them into the country are breached. The Issuing Chamber must receive an equivalent security from the Carnet user. The security must be for an amount equal to the highest rate and taxes applicable to the goods in any country of destination and transit if applicable (percentage of a possible 10% penalty as set down by the International ATA Convention). It will disregard any preferential tariffs that may be in force at the time because Customs authorities may demand goods such preferential rates. The security to the nearest pound must be given in one of the following ways: By cash or a Banker, Credit bank or insurance company guarantee. (In which case the bank or insurance company must comply with certain criteria) or through the Carnet Security Scheme. Such a guarantee will only be accepted when given on the Issuing Chamber's official form.

**MAIN CATEGORY OF GOODS:**

- a) Commercial Samples
- b) International Trade Fair/Exhibition
- c) Professional Equipment (is solely for use by or under the personal supervision of the holder or his nominated representative and excludes equipment to be used for the construction, repair or maintenance of buildings or for earthmoving and like projects).

Bahrain	Category (b) only
Brazil	Category (b) and (c) only at present Transit between states currently not allowed.
Canada	Category (a) only; However, if you wish to have a Carnet for Professional Equipment category (c), we will require a letter of indemnity on your company headed paper, accepting responsibility if the Carnet is refused.
Channel Islands	The Chamber is able to issue Carnets for companies based in the UK as well as Channel Island based companies if so requested (20% security applies).
China	All Carnets used in China must be registered on the Chinese customs database by contacting CCPIT/CCOIC before clearing the goods through customs.
India	Category (b) and (c) only at present. Carnets will need to be registered with FICCI when clearing Indian customs
Kazakhstan	Category (b) and (c) only at present
Indonesia	Category (b) and (c) only at present
Lebanon	Category (b) and (c) only at present.
Mexico	Mexican customs require a translation of the list of goods into Spanish. To facilitate importation holders must notify Mexican customs in advance through CANNACO's Website at <a href="http://www.carnet-cata.org">www.carnet-cata.org</a>
Mongolia	Category (b) and (c) only at present
Morocco	Category (b) only; However, we would accept a letter of indemnity on your company headed paper for other categories, accepting responsibility if the Carnet is refused.
Pakistan	Category (b) and (c) only at present
Qatar	Category (b) only.
Russian Federation	As we are unable to guarantee acceptance by RF customs, we will require a letter of indemnity on your company headed paper, accepting responsibility if the Carnet is refused. Passport number of Authorised Representative must be shown in Box B. Carnet Holders are advised to engage a local Customs Broker to help with Carnet clearance.
Spain	Carnets are compulsory in the Canary Islands, Ceuta and Melilla. Rates on request.
Tunisia	Category (b) and (c) only at present
Turkey	Only named representatives/agents listed in Box B. Represented by, on the importation and re-exportation vouchers will be allowed to sign the importation and re-exportation declarations in Boxes F. General List (in Excel format) should be carried on a USB stick as this may be requested by Turkish Customs.
UAE	Category (b) only.
United States of America	Category (a) and (c) only, We are unable to guarantee the acceptance of an ATA Carnet covering 'vehicles'.

**CPD/CHINA-TAIWAN CARNET**

Agreement has been reached between the EC, Taiwan and the International Chamber of Commerce to establish a system of Carnets similar to that for ATA Carnets. The Carnet covers goods temporarily imported/exported between the UK and Taiwan and is called an CPD/China-Taiwan Carnet. (CPD = Carnet de Passage). Other than a different colour code and A4 format to distinguish it from the ATA Carnet, the conditions of its use, the goods for which it can be used and UK Customs procedures are identical to those for the ATA Carnet.
