LOCAL POLICY PRIORITIES

The Berkshire Local Area Assembly has identified the following local policy priorities:

- As designated Employer Representative Body, deliver the next stages of the Berkshire <u>Local Skills Improvement Plan</u>.
- Champion the key infrastructure proposals that are crucial to stimulating investment and boosting growth in the Berkshire economy, including

 (i) the timely delivery of the <u>Western Rail Link to H</u>eathrow;
 (ii) promote wider use and availability of public transport to key nodes, such as Heathrow;
 (iii) provide smart multi-modal mobility & simple ticketing;
 (iv) optimise the provision of low carbon alternatives.
- Continue to support existing exporters and help other businesses grow their trade activity, by identifying and addressing the inherent trade challenges facing our business community.
- Encourage proposals that can help secure the appropriate mix of development and the highest standard of urban design, planning, and infrastructure provision across Berkshire.
- Engage our key stakeholders and anchor institutions to help deliver the wider aims of our own, and their policy, economic and investment aims and objectives.
- Maintain our call for Local Plans and planning system to facilitate inward investment and businesses growth.
- Retain our focus on lobbing government and stakeholders to ensure there is sufficient power available to enable business to move toward zero emissions.
- Showcase the good practice and promote the initiatives being developed by TVCC's Sustainability Working Group to help business on their pathway to net-zero, help SMEs navigate the ESG landscape.
- Strengthen our systems leadership approach that fosters stronger partnership working and enables direct engagement with the Leaders and Chief Executives of our Unitary Authorities, anchor institutions and other key stakeholders.

- Support initiatives that will help re-imagine the County towns and attract the appropriate levels of investment to secure their future vitality, vibrancy, and employment opportunities.
- Work to help promote the County's key assets (e.g., Green Park, Slough Industrial Estate, and Thames Valley Science Park) and centres of excellence (e.g., Jealott's Hill, Royal Berkshire Foundation Trust Hospital and University of Reading) that will drive higher volumes and value FDI into Berkshire.
