Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism

- **EU policy:** Devised to tackle carbon leakage and potential off-shoring of complying with emissions commitments from Paris and subsequent climate agreements.
- **Carbon leakage:** Scenario where companies move production of goods to countries with less onerous rules on embedded carbon emissions in goods.
- **Regulation (EU) 2023/956:** - adopts a system of declarations and certificates under the EU Emissions Trading Scheme – phased in between Q4 2023 and Q1 2026.
- **Implementing Regulation:** - provides further details in terms of quarterly reporting by the importer of record within the EU – requires liaison between the importer and the UK supplier in embedded emissions in six sectors – including aluminium, iron/steel, fertilisers, hydrogen, electricity production to produce the required reports


Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism

- **UK policy:** UK government has now agreed to implement its own CBAM to operate from 2027.
- Seeks consultation with business and industry on design of the UK model.
- No policy decision on seeking to link UK and EU ETS to avoid fiscal barriers to UK exports to the EU – BCC supports ETS linkage.


